History of corner establishment since Original Government Survey

In Holden's notes of December, 1901, and March, 1902, Fred Holden calls for a dragtooth at this corner. One of his bearing trees was a 20" white oak, S53°E, 36 links. In December of 1895, Kenyon (or Schroeder?) was at this corner. Nothing else on record since the original survey.

Description of corner evidence found: On the 5th of April I found Holden's dragtooth. I also found his bearing tree in the Southeast quadrant, although my distance is longer than Holden's. Holden's distance to the center would have been about 24.6'. There appeared to have been a scar on the NW side of the tree. I cut into the tree and found what appeared to me to be evidence of an overgrown scar. I removed the dragtooth and replaced it with a Harrison marker. The See Reverse Side dragtooth measured 1"x11".
