History of corner establishment since Original Government Survey

I, William C. Jung , do hereby certify that on the \_\_\_\_\_ \_\_\_19\_80 , I found July (evidence) (no evidence) of the West 1/4 corner of Section 12 . T19 N. R 1 E Fourth Principal Meridian, and I reestablished said corner according to the Wisconsin Statutes as shown and described hereon.

Holden shows a piece of R.R. rail at this corner in his notes of March and September, 1903. The old town road records all show the corner to be at the road intersection. Kennedy used the road intersection as the corner in about 1937+.

Description of corner evidence found:

Searched for Holdens corner and found nothing. I accepted the road intersection as the best available evidence of the original government survey. Field evidence and measurements support this, as do the old records. Set a 14"x29" square iron bar at the corner.
