PLANNING, REPORTS, BUDGET

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2000 NEEDS OBJECTIVE AND FORMAT

Objectives: To provide guidelines which define the optimum level of activities that should be undertaken to achieve full potential benefits from the forest.

Format and Policy:

Needs for the county forest shall be listed without regard to budgetary constraints or other limitations. This list shall identify the forest potential in terms of public benefits, investments or opportunities, and financial returns. Silvicultural needs of the county forest are identified in the Forest Compartment Reconnaissance printout. The DNR Public Lands Handbook describes procedures for use of this information. Other needs shall be determined by the Committee and the forest administrator, with technical assistance from the DNR and other interested agencies or individuals qualified to provide such assistance.

2005 DETAILED ANNUAL NEEDS FOR FIFTEEN YEARS

Annual silvicultural needs are identified in the Forest Compartment Reconnaissance printout. The printout, referenced in the plan, is available in the County Forest administrator's office. Printout listings include timber harvests, tree planting, and other silvicultural activities. Other unanticipated needs will be addressed in accordance with procedures outlined in this plan. These items will be identified and plans made for implementation, as part of the annual budget work plan prepared by the administrator and Committee. Annual work plans are approved by the County Board and Division of Forestry and forwarded to the DNR as required by statute (s. 28.11(5)(b) and s.28.11(5m)(b), Wis. Stats.

2010 SUMMARY OF FIFTEEN-YEAR NEEDS

A schedule giving a summary of silvicultural needs and other needs for the period covered by this plan in this chapter. Specific items are budgeted during the annual Monroe County budgeting process which occurs from July – November. The

following is a list of those budget categories:

- Equipment purchases: trucks, ATV's, GPS equipment, etc.
- Roads: construction, maintenance
- Land acquisition goals

As parcels become available the county will research the possibilities and acquire parcels or that are a good fit for the county forest. The county will consider adding existing county owned lands into the County Forest Law.

- Property maintenance: surveying
 - 5-10 miles of boundary maintenance are completed annually. This includes the establishment of property corners by the county surveyor and marking out boundaries with fence posts by the Forestry & Parks Department staff. Most of the boundary maintenance should be completed within the next 5-10 years.
- Recreation:

The county will evaluate the recreational needs throughout the County Forest and Parks. The county is researching the feasibility of building an additional shower building at McMullen Park along with adding additional camp sites as the need arises.

Monroe County is in the process of acquiring eleven acres of lake access in the Town of Byron adjacent to Copper Road. Once the mining and reclamation are complete (5-7 years) on this property, the Forestry & Parks Department will be developing the site for public recreation. The development possibilities include a boat launch, parking area, picnic shelter, toilet building and camp sites.

• Personnel:

The county will be look at developing a full time Forestry & Parks assistant to manage the day to day operations at the parks and assist with forestry tasks.

2015 WORK PLAN OBJECTIVE AND POLICY

OBJECTIVE

To develop an annual work plan and budget that will satisfy the needs specified in Chapter 1000 to the greatest extent feasible, consistent with program priorities established in the Mission Statement.

POLICY

The County Forest program will sustain a level of operation that considers the needs of the forest and the public in accordance with the goals identified in Chapter 100.

2020 ANNUAL WORK PLAN AND BUDGET

Each year an Annual Work Plan and Budget shall be prepared by the Forest Administrator with assistance from the Committee and the DNR liaison forester. This plan shall be based upon the detailed annual needs contained in Section 1100 of the Plan. Annual work plans are approved by the County Board and Division of Forestry and forwarded to the DNR as required by Wisconsin statutes s. 28.11(5)(b) and s.28.11(5m)(b). Following County Board approval, a copy is provided to official copy-holders of the County Forest Comprehensive Land Use Plan for inclusion as an amendment in this chapter.

INTRODUCTION:

This work plan is intended to give a general overview of the accomplishment goals for 2021, not be a blueprint of what will or will not be done. Issues such as funding, weather, harvesting activity and workload will ultimately impact what will be accomplished. Due to unforeseen circumstances it maybe expedient and prudent to perform more of one activity at the expense of another, with the understanding that at another time the situation may be reversed.

TIMBER SALE ADMINISTRATION:

There are seven active timber sale contracts on the county forest. Normal administrative procedures for timber sales include:

- Advertising the sale and negotiating the contract.
- Meeting with the purchaser before the job is started to go over the sale requirements.

- Routinely inspecting the sale once the harvest has started to confirm contract compliance.
- Collecting load tickets and tracking the volume and type of wood being harvested.
- Making sure landing and road repair is done properly following the harvest.
- Balancing the sale ledger and completing the cutting report at sale close out.

TIMBER SALE PLANNING AND ESTABLISHMENT:

The goals for timber sale establishment and sale in 2021 are:

- Approximately 115 acres of timber will be set up and sold.
- All of the acres will be even-aged harvests with reserve trees and reserve pockets of trees.

Normal sale establishment procedures include:

- Consulting the compartment reconnaissance to determine harvest needs for the year.
- Inspecting the scheduled stands to determine if a harvest is appropriate.
- Marking the timber to be sold in a manner appropriate for the type of sale.
- Preparing a sale prospectus and completing the cutting notice.

FOREST RECONNAISSANCE:

- The goal for compartment reconnaissance in 2021 is 354 acres.
- Reconnaissance of completed timber sales will be done as they are closed out.
- Regeneration surveys will be performed on stands recently harvested.

TIMBER STAND IMPROVEMENT:

• Invasive treatments with herbicides will be performed on timber sale areas before they are sold.

REFORESTATION:

Natural regeneration is anticipated on the mature sites that will be harvested.

FISH AND WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES:

The normal activities associated with the Karner blue butterfly program and the maintenance of wildlife openings will continue during 2021.

A one acre prescribed burn will be completed to promote native grasses and forbs.

2025 ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORTS OBJECTIVE AND POLICY

OBJECTIVE

To provide a quantifiable means of evaluating progress on both short and long term goals on the Monroe County Forest.

POLICY

Annual accomplishments will be recorded as a historical record, to assist in future planning, and to provide documentation for both the County, and the County Forest system. This information is invaluable in addressing public, County Board, and other legislative inquiries on the operation of the Forest as well as assessing progress on goals.

2030 ANNUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORTS

A copy of an annual accomplishment report may be prepared and provided to members of the County Board and to official copyholders of this Plan for inclusion into this chapter.

This report shall include the following:

- 1. Timber sale accomplishments including gross and net sale receipts and harvest goals achieved.
- 2. Timber stand improvements accomplishments.
- 3. Recreation development and maintenance accomplishments including recreation revenues and expenses.
- 4. Wildlife management accomplishments including revenues and expenses.
- 5. Fisheries management accomplishments including revenues and expenses.
- 6. Other accomplishments identified as "needs" in Chapter 1000.
