Fort McCoy Update presented by T. Townsell

- 1. Fort McCoy is requiring mask usage for all persons regardless of their vaccination status.

- 3. The natural resource work continues without interruption as it is primarily outdoors.
- 4. Community leaders are engaging area educators to utilize Fort McCoy for area school field trips.
- 5. Fort McCoy is being visited by senior officers to observe usage and implantation of COVID precautions due to their continued success.
- 6. A community appreciation event is being planned for August 26th with a reminder that masks will be required.

- 3. **LCD Director's Report** provided and presented by B. Micheel (see attached) with the following addition:
 - Land Stewardship Award winners have been notified of their award and it was announced in the local papers as well.
 - NRCS announced they will no longer be providing inspection for dams that are past their 50 service life. The county will need to take on that expense/responsibility. There are 5 functioning dams in Monroe County. Grant Funding for this expense is being researched.
 - Intern L. Adams and M. Yancey presented a verbal overview of their summer accomplishments. Including inspecting and documenting bridges, culverts, and stream crossing throughout townships in Monroe County, which included assessments of water flow, fish habitat and how structures are reacting to erosion and flooding.
- 4. **Fishing Easements** (2) 20 year fishing easements were converted to perpetual easements: Arnold Muenzenberger, Lowell Fromm. A new fishing easement was signed by Connie Meyer

 - Sale 162 is complete. Sale 150 is in progress. Handicap Assessable Facilities for the Angelo Wayside were requested, awaiting response. The insurance check from the fire at site 63 purchased the replacement of the electrical pedestal, removal of damaged trees, and lost revenue. The insurance company is subrogating against the responsible party. Outdoor Rec plan is a county/community plan that expired and a new plan is being worked on.

- 1. **Deke Slayton/Bike Museum** Report provided and presented by A. Young (see attached) with the following addition: Museum hours are 1-4 Tuesday Saturday. A second Chicken Q is planned for September. The August Space camp was held with a shift to Zoom due to COVID.
- 2. NRCS Report presented by M. Komiskey
 - a. NRCS continues to obligate EQIP Programs, Perform compliance reviews for land that is highly Erodible or Wetland, contract CRP with FSA, and preparing for the end of the fiscal year.
- 3. DNR Forestry Reports:
 - Warden Report presented by M. Modjeski detailing a recent timber violation that he worked with C. Callum, ending with the land owner being ordered to pay a substantial forfeiture. And detailed that the active buck theft case court case has been completed. The buck was stolen from the back of the owner truck and was returned to the owner within 25 hours. Theft resulted in fines, criminal charges and revocation of DNR privileges.
 - **Forester Report** Presented by C. Gilman with an update that active timber sales continue. Bid will be accepted for timber sales in the West Salem School forest. Climate Change Task Force will meet in August and a complete a forest tour.
