

ORDINANCE NO. 4.07

Re: ATV Route Designation

The Village Board of the Village of Warrens, located in Monroe County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The following ordinance is hereby created to read as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 4.07

§ 1.0 ATV Route Designation

Subject to the terms of this ordinance, and section 23.33(a), Wis. Stats., the Village Board may from time to time designate by resolution, public highways within the Village as all-terrain vehicle routes. However, no state trunk highway or connecting highway may be designated as an all-terrain vehicle route unless the Wisconsin Department of Transportation approves of the designation. In addition, the Village Board may by resolution designate corridors through land which the Village owns or controls, for use as all-terrain vehicle trails. With respect to any designation made under this ordinance, the following shall apply:

- (a) Routes and corridors so designated by resolution shall not be used by all-terrain vehicles or utility terrain vehicles during certain periods of each year designated by resolution.

- (b) The Village, in cooperation with the cooperation of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, shall establish uniform vehicle route and trail signs and standards for the operation of all-terrain vehicles and utility-terrain vehicles on all-terrain vehicle routes and trails. No person may intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, obstruct or interfere with the effective operation of any uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign or standard or any uniform sign or standard for the operation of a utility-terrain vehicle on any all-terrain vehicle route or trail. In the event any person should do the foregoing, they should pay a forfeiture of not less than \$500,

- (c) In this subsection, "highways with within the village" means all highways within the Village, except state highways. Residents of the Village and their guests and registered guests of lodging establishments in the Village are authorized to operate all-terrain vehicles on highways within the Village that are not designated as all-terrain vehicle routes for the sole purpose of accessing the all-terrain vehicle route nearest the resident's residence or registered guest's place of lodging by way of the shortest available route from the residence or lodging establishment to the nearest all-terrain route. A person operating an all-terrain vehicle on highways within the Village as authorized herein may operate the all-terrain


vehicle only upon the shoulder of the highway. A person operating an all-terrain vehicle on highways within the Village as authorized herein shall do all of the following:


1. Observe speed limits applicable to the travelled highway, but not to exceed 10 mph.
2. Operate the all-terrain vehicle on the extreme right of the roadway and travel with the flow of traffic.
3. Not operate the all-terrain vehicle abreast of another all-terrain vehicle or other vehicle travelling in the same direction except when being overtaken and passed by another vehicle. When riding with more than one all-terrain vehicle, the all-terrain vehicles shall be operated in single file and passing is not permitted.
4. Operate the all-terrain vehicle's headlight and taillight at all times.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its publication (or publication of a notice thereof) as provided for by law, following its adoption by the Village Board.
