 - J. Roll made note the History building roof is still in the process of being fixed from the recent windstorm and insurance will likely cover all repair costs.

A motion was made by D. Pierce to accept the History report as presented. Second by J. Schmitz. Motion carries 4-0-1 (P. Zastoupil not voting)

Deke Slayton/Bike Museum Report (Young) – A. Young not present, no report submitted.

- 3. Agriculture Report Provided and presented by B. Halfman {see attached}.
 - B. Halfman noted the March 18th "Heart of the Farm Workshop" in Bangor will need to be rescheduled due to lack of promotion.
- 4. 4H & Youth Development Report Provided and presented by J. Goede (see attached).
 - J. Goede mentioned 1 youth (senior in Sparta) will be going on the "American Spirit Trip" which will be the first state-wide, overnight, out-of-state 4-H event since March of 2020. Extension was able to assist with fundraising to allow the student to participate.
 - J. Goede mentioned he will be putting on a "Colors Training" with the Health Department on March 30, 2022 which will be a cross-department training.

5. Health & Well-Being/Food Wise Report (Anderson) –A. Anderson not present, report submitted electronically {see attached}

A motion was made by R. Luethe to accept the Extension Office report as presented. Second by D. Pierce. Motion carries 4-0-1 (P. Zastoupil not voting)

Fort McCoy Update (Townsell) -

- 1. Original economic impact for 2021 was \$1.93 billion which was another record set in a year.
- 2. About 116,000 soldiers trained (which is good in this pandemic era).
- 3. Masks are now optional at Fort McCoy, except at health care facilities where they are still required.
- 4. Last service members with "Task Force McCoy" are in the process of leaving.
- 5. Fort McCoy fishing opportunities can be found at https://mccoy.isportsman.net/
- 6. A 73 lb., approximately 3 year-old wolf was caught in a coyote trap. The USDA Wildlife services were brought in and they were able to put a GPS collar on her.
- 7. Prescribed burning training is continuing at Fort McCoy.
- 8. Timber sales continue going on, there will be more sales later this year as well.
- 9. Managing for invasive plant species is continuing. There will be an Invasive Species outing open to the public scheduled for either April 7th or April 14th.
- 10. In response to any rumors that Fort McCoy will be starting to take in Ukraine refugees, there is no confirmation on this rumor.

NRCS Report (Krause) – *V. Blount presented in place of N. Krause*

- 1. Between RCPP and EQIP applications, 17 were approved for funding.
- 2. The classic CSP application is past, with renewal sign-ups still going on. Currently working on processing classic sign-up applications.

Land Conservation Department (Micheel)

- 1. Review February Expenditures Report provided and presented by B. Micheel (see attached).
 - B. Micheel called attention to the \$510 bill from the deeds office for releasing Non-Point Watershed Agreements.
- 2. PL566 Dam Coalition/Inspection RFP's Review/Approve -
 - B. Micheel explained that NRCS provided the inspections to meet the DNR requirements for all PL566 structures under federal interest or 50 year operation & maintenance agreements. Recently, NRCS to pull inspection services for all structure beyond the 50 year interest effective in 2023. This means sponsors (Monroe County) will need to hire a private engineer for this service. In the Coon Creek Watershed, this equates to once every 10 years for 4 structures.

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- B. Micheel explained the PL566 Dam Coalition was formed back in the early 1990s and is the mechanism for negotiating any issues that come up relating to the dams. There are about 63 dams shared between about a dozen counties.
- B. Micheel explained the plan is to come together and put a RFP out to private engineers that have been involved in PL566 dam inspections in the past and have them submit a package bid on that proposal. The plan in Monroe County would be 1 inspection every 10 years for 4 structures.
- B. Micheel clarified he is proposing putting together a RFP with neighboring counties in order to get the best price possible for inspections moving forward. All Land Conservation Departments are going to their committees having this same discussion in order to put out RFPs out in April.

A motion was made by R. Luethe to accept the PL566 Dam Coalition/Inspection RFP's as presented. Second by J. Schmitz. Motion carries 5-0-1 (P. Zastoupil voting)

- 3. PL566 Decommissioning plan Presentation Presented by B. Micheel
 - Reviewed the decommissioning plan for the three breached structures in the Coon Creek Watershed. Potential cost-share for 3 breached dams – Federal (NRCS) cost sharing 70% of cost, Monroe County share would be 15-30%, and the DNR Municipal Dam Grant Program *could* potentially cover up to 50% of the remaining cost.
 - The earliest the decommissioning efforts could begin would be this fall, but likely they will not begin until 2023 based on receiving federal funding.
- 4. Clean Water Resolution Review/Approve Provided and presented by B. Micheel {see attached}
 - B. Micheel called attention to the addition of language in the Resolution "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Monroe County expects that the Governor of the State of Wisconsin and the members of the Wisconsin Legislature, especially those representing Monroe County, financially support, to the fullest, programs and staff funding to allow Monroe County to protect surface and ground water for current and future citizens."

A motion was made by D. Pierce to accept the Clean Water Resolution as presented. Second by R. Luethe. Motion carries 5-0-1 (P. Zastoupil voting)

- 5. LCD Director's Report Report provided and presented by B. Micheel {see attached}
 - B. Micheel noted R. Anderson reported LCD could utilize the Hazard Mitigation Grant to fund 2 summer interns. The interns will continue phase 2 of the "Crossing Assessment Inventory". B. Micheel will be working with HR to roll out the position announcement to local colleges.

- 6. Land Use Planner Report (R. Anderson) Report provided and presented by R. Anderson.
 - R. Anderson touched on the data summary from the 283 responses to the "Monroe County Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan". N. VanWychen confirmed the committee would be interested in a summary of the findings presented at the next meeting.
- 7. Soil & Water Conservationist Reports (Richardson & B. Anderson) Report submitted electronically (see attached).

Forestry & Parks (C. Ziegler)

- 1. Forestry & Parks Updates Provided and presented by C. Ziegler {see attached}.
 - C. Ziegler clarified that the "Time Standards Recalculation" refers to the amount of work hours the DNR puts in on county forest land.
 - C. Ziegler clarified the "Fecon Mowing on State lands" the area along Copper Rd was mowed to control a large Buckthorn infestation. The next step is to spray the young regrowth in the spring.
 - C. Ziegler noted the county is partnering with the City of Sparta on a joint application to create an 80 ft. bridge over the La Crosse River in the golf course area.
- 2. Set Minimum Bid for Lincoln Withdrawal
 - C. Ziegler stated the DNR was wondering if the County was setting a minimum bid for the Lincoln parcel. The committee decided there was no need to set a minimum bid for the parcel so long as any and all bids can be rejected (if they are considered too low).
- **3.** Review February Expenditures Provided and presented by C. Ziegler (see attached).

Highlighted Projects and Activities by Jarrod Roll, Hannah Scholze, and Volunteers

- Provided in-person educational programming to 155 students
- Returned to owners the items loaned to the Christmas exhibit
- Created year-end financial report for MCLHR by documenting all sources income and expenses and generating a report which compares 2021 to previous years
- Submitted annual report to the Wisconsin Historical Society (an obligation of being an Affiliate), reporting income, expenses, audience served, programming provided, exhibits, etc.
- Updated Monroe County Immigration exhibit with new labels and paint
- Processed new donations to LHR including assigning accession numbers, researching history of said items, and locating a storage space for each
- Began promoting the March 31 public program about the Census, including creating a flyer and posting info about the program online
- Painted Men's bathroom, replaced damaged ceiling tiles, and washed walls
- Attended the first La Crosse Historical Society regional museum planning session
- Served on a National Endowment for the Humanities panel for Preservation Assistance Grants for Smaller Institutions; reviewed and evaluated 13 grant applications submitted by historical organizations from around the United States

In addition to the projects listed above, the Director supervises the following volunteer and support staff who are currently performing their tasks in the Museum Building:

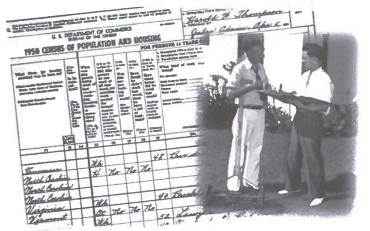

Agriculture Program Highlights February 4, 2022 through March 4, 2022

The Private Pesticide Applicator Certification workshops have been completed. One-hundred-twenty-six individuals attended the trainings that were held in the county this year. Additional people will take the test at the office using the self-study or on-line training option.

The Ag Agent assisted the Western Wisconsin Beef Producers Coop with their annual business meeting. Brian Winnekins was their guest speaker and the Ag Agent gave the group an update on Beef Quality Assurance Certification, who needs it and how to obtain it.

The UW Extension Cow-Calf workshops were held in February, with one "in-person" held at Hillsboro for our area, with an attendance of about 45 people. Other locations were Abbotsford, and Prairie du Chien. The Abbotsford location was also available for people to join virtually, and we had some area people participate virtually. The theme of the cow-calf workshops this year was successful selection and development of replacement heifers for the beef cow herd.

The UW Cattle Feeders workshops were held virtually with the keynote speaker being Dr. Galen Erickson, University of Nebraska Feedlot Specialist. Dr. Erickson discussed management considerations for cattle feeders when feed prices were high and shared results from his research program on use of Enogen corn hybrids in rations. A market outlook was presented by Dr. Boetel and the Ag Agent presented information on how cattle handling and stockmanship influence cattle performance in the feedlot.

The 13th Annual Hops production conference was held on Feb 26th in Eau Claire. It was a joint conference with Minnesota and Wisconsin. The event was held in person with a virtual option. There were 31 people in person and 33 people who joined virtually. Topics included an update on a cost of production project UW Extension is conducting, a presentation on a different approach to plant management at the soil level, a report on our nitrogen rate trials, an update on the USDA- ARS hops breeding program, and an update on exports and marketing requirements.

The industrial hemp trial summary from 2021 plots is almost completed.

The Ag Agent worked with individuals on farm land rental arrangements, investigating livestock enterprise options, and calf housing and freestall housing options among the day to day calls and inquiries.



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Work continues with the Ho Chunk Nation to assist them with a strategic planning process for their Agriculture Division.

Agents 4 Change

The group will be debuting an alcohol presentation in March to the 6th grade in Cashton. We will host an afterschool training on March 16th to teach the material to the student mentors. We will then teach the lesson to both sections of 6th grade on March 23rd. There are 9 Cashton students interested in the program so we will work on incorporating them in the training and teaching in March.

Clover College

Our annual winter fun day for our youngest members was February 19th at the Sparrow's Nest. The Jr. Leaders led six activities. The lessons were on pork, Newton's 3rd law, stored energy, painting, outdoor fun, and cute owl snacks. The Jr. Leaders really like teaching and leading, and the little ones love the Jr. Leaders spending time with them. We had 17 Jr. Leaders teaching and counseling and 23 young Cloverbud all having fun at the Abbey just outside Sparta.

KITS (Kids Interested in Trying Stuff)

In March we partnered with Firefly Mercantile outside of Cashton to talk about growing plants in March. The KITS contained seeds, seed starter, starting pots, and instructions. We also made a video with Andre the owner. April will be our final KITS with paper flowers to encourage spring to stay around.

Super Fun Project Day

The next quarterly Super Fun Project Days is planned for March 26, 2022. We will be in Wilton's Community Center. We have no bake fun, electricity, cosmetology, gnome crafts, and Cloverbud activities planned.

Shooting Sports

We have started the archer & air rifle program. There have been around 30 youth shooting each night. There is much excitement to be do fun things with 4-H again. It is hard not to catch the excitement. Summer dates have been established the first three weeks of June for powder sports at the Cataract Sportsmen Club.

Fur, Fin, & Feather

. This year we are planning an expanded version of the show. Four counites, Monroe, LaCrosse, Richland, and Vernon have teamed up to make a great event. Farm & Fleet has granted us funds to cover the rental of the building. We will be looking for other raffle items. We held a virtual Rabbit Show Training on February 22. There were 97 youth on the ZOOM. There is a Poultry Show Training happening on March 15. There are over 100 youth signed up for that event as well. Coon Creek Dams No. 21, 23, 24, 25, 29, 31, 53

Dear Chair VanWychen:

The Federal interest is complete for the above listed Watershed dams; which means that the service life of these dams has exceeded the economic evaluation period used in the Watershed Work Plans to justify Federal funding of the original design and construction.

As a result of the Federal interest being completed, NRCS can no longer prioritize engineering assistance for the formal inspection and needed repair plans for these dams. We encourage you to coordinate with the County Sponsors of similar Watershed dams and consider hiring a private consultant who can provide continuity in inspection services, assist with urgent repair plans, and apply for grant funding opportunities.

NRCS will continue to provide engineering assistance in the following areas:

- Transfer original design documents, plans, and specifications to a private consultant through DamWatch®, a web-based software application that provides early warning alerts and record management.
- Prioritize the review of repair plans prepared by a private consultant to ensure they meet the original design standards and remain eligible for future Federal assistance through the Emergency Watershed Protection Program or Dam Rehabilitation Program.
- Respond to technical inquires as resources allow.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Dam Safety Program maintains a list of qualified engineers who can perform inspections at https://dnr.wisconsin.gov/topic/Dams. The typical ranges from approximately \$2,000 to \$10,000 per inspection per dam. In accordance with Wisconsin Statute 31.19, formal inspections are performed by a registered professional engineer with experience in design and operation of dams, and reports are submitted to the DNR.

WHEREAS, the Land Conservation Department is directly involved in local and regional discussions focusing on surface and groundwater issues and is statutorily charged with addressing issues related to these topics.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Monroe County Board of Supervisors establish a right to clean water to protect human health, the environment, and the diverse cultural and natural heritage of Wisconsin for the citizens of Monroe County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, in recognition of this right to clean water, that actions, policies, plans and procedures of the County of Monroe will reflect the intent to conserve, protect and restore clean water.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Monroe County expects that the Governor of the State of Wisconsin and the members of the Wisconsin Legislature, especially those representing Monroe County, financially support, to the fullest, programs and staff funding to allow Monroe County to protect surface and ground water for current and future citizens.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Monroe County Clerk is directed to send a copy of this resolution and the voting results, if approved, to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Counties Association, all Wisconsin County Boards, and to members of the State Legislature representing Monroe County and Monroe County Municipalities and Townships.
