

History of corner establishment since Original Government Survey

CERTIFIED LAND CORNER

There was nothing on record in the old County Surveyor Records. In 1961 Harley Sime set an iron pipe at the occupied corner. Sime found what he believed to be evidence of the two original government witness trees. This evidence fit the occupied corner. Feddersen used this pipe as the Description of corner evidence found: corner in a survey done in July of 1978.

I found Sime's old pipe, removed it and replaced it with a Harrison marker. I accepted this as the best available evidence of the original government corner.
