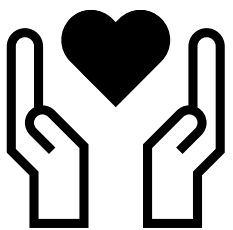

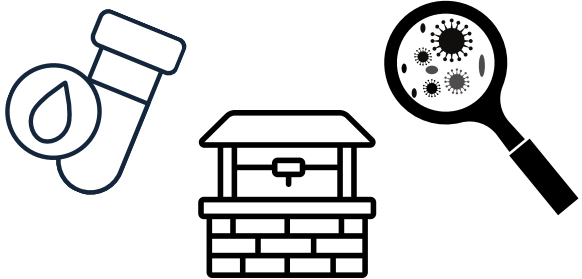
Loan Closet: Medical equipment that can be rented to residents - including wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, commodes, seat risers & more.

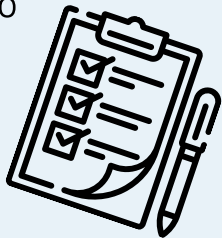

Public health threats can be caused by natural, accidental, or unintentional means. Being prepared to prevent, respond to, & rapidly recover from public health threats is critical for protecting & securing our residents' public health. The Monroe County Health Department wants to ensure that you are informed & prepared for public health emergencies within Monroe County.



Healthy Families:

Cribs for Kids & Car Seat Programs

ensure eligible families have a safe environment for their infants to sleep & appropriate, proper-fitting car seats.



Maternal Child Health offers support, education, & resources for parents related to pregnancy & childbirth.

Reading Empowers Development (RED) Program

educates parents on the importance of reading to their children & providing them with age-appropriate books. Books are available in English & Spanish for children 6, 12, & 24 months of age.



Safety for All Kids (SAK) Packs provide home safety kits & education to families that meet eligibility guidelines.
