

November 1 Destroy

Control: just like any other woody species:

- Basal Bark
- Stump Treat
- Hack 'n' Squirt

Herbicide:

- 20% glyphosate
- Triclopyr Ester



Fall Hack n Squirt with 20% a.i. glyphosate

November 7 Destroy

Cuttin' for Stump Treatin'



November 7 Destroy

Cut and Pile on site, otherwise risk transporting seeds to other locations

Destroy Continues

Stump Treating with triclopyr ester via a paint roller

Thus ends Amur Maple Season




Possible Look-alikes

- Other Maples
 - Box Elder hold on to seeds well into winter/spring, somewhat similar growth form, bark/leaves different
 - Red Maple bright red fall foliage, different growth form
 - Silver Maple leaf shape is similar (if you squint), bark color
- "Maple leaf looking" Viburnums leaf shape and similar shrubby growth form
- Virginia Creeper Bright red fall foliage at same time as Amur Maple's bright red foliage
