Two Interns present today. Going out to the Town of Portland to compile assessment on the inventory. Will begin on outer townships first. Three – Four done per day to start. Putting tools together to make easier in field. Highway Department is assisting also. In August there will be a presentation on that project. Asking \$50/per township to put towards the efforts.
