

Accessing Recorded Survey Documents vs Filed Survey Documents

Recorded Survey Documents: Subdivision Plats, Assessor Plats, Certified Survey Maps, and Condominiums.

There are two options for accessing recorded survey documents, in-person by going to the [Register of Deeds Office](#) or by accessing them online. If you wish to access them online the Document Number for the recorded survey will be found by looking at the Simultaneous Conveyance Source Document field (SimConvSourceDoc) in the popup window where you found the hyperlink to get here. In some cases the actual Document Number may not be available yet. We strive for perfection but there is also the possibility errors may be present in this data which was not originally intended for online access. If you wish to proceed there are currently two options offered by the Register of Deeds Office to obtain access to records:

- [Tapestry](#) – For occasional users. Pay as you go with a credit card.
- [Laredo](#) – For everyday users – Monthly subscription available.

Notice: Please note that we have modernized our recording system and how the public may search and purchase documents online. Please contact our office if you would like to subscribe to Laredo. Older documents recorded after 1935 may be accessed through Laredo by entering the volume, page and/or document number. Remote access is also available through Tapestry. Older documents recorded after 1935 may be accessed through Tapestry by entering the document number. See numerical list to find document number.

Legal descriptions are not indexed for documents recorded prior to 1986. Please refer to our Real Estate Tract Index/COLORTRACT and search by legal description to access those documents.

Filed Survey Documents: Survey Plats, Plats of Survey, Certified Survey Records, Unrecorded Surveys, etc.

These documents are not recorded in the register of deeds office and are filed by the County Surveyor. They are available online sorted by section and town/range from the [County Surveyor Page](#) and in some cases accessibly directly via a link in the field you just clicked.
