OBTAINING ESSENTIAL PROPERTY WHEN NO-CONTACT

If there is a no contact order in effect and you need help making arrangements to obtain your personal essential belongings (medication, clothing, personal hygiene products, etc) you may contact the Justice Programs Office 24/7 either in person (Monroe County Justice Programs/Justice Department) located at 112 S. Court Street Sparta, WI (first floor of the Justice Center), call 608-269-8835, or by email jbonds@co.monroe.wi.us.

The Justice Department cannot help with child placement, child visitation or non-essential items (tv's, computers, video games, etc). Please note that Justice Department Staff will not go to the residence to help obtain belongings. Our role is to help you make arrangements to obtain your personal belongings.

When reporting in person to the Justice Department please come prepared with the no contact's phone number and phone numbers for potential third party individuals (friends, family members, coworkers, neighbors, etc) that may be able and willing to assist you in the property exchange.

Monroe County Justice Department will attempt to call the no-contact and make arrangements; however, if the no-contact is unwilling or we are unable to reach them, then Monroe County Justice Department will cease involvement and you will need to contact an attorney regarding this civil matter. Law Enforcement does not get involved in property exchanges.
