#### Highlighted Projects and Activities by Jarrod Roll, Hannah Scholze, and Volunteers

- Provided educational programming to students at Brookwood High School, guiding them in their own history exhibit projects
- Hosted multiple groups from Rolling Hills coming to see the North Pole Holiday display
- Disassembled the Holiday Display: returned each piece to its box, placed boxes in tubs, disassembled the wood structure labelling each piece for future re-use, and oversaw the transfer of the whole thing to offsite storage
- Shifted contents previously stored in off-site storage room #2 to off-site storage room #3 since LHR decided to downsize from three to two storage rooms
- Updated and repaired exhibit elements needing attention
- Worked with County HR to create a want ad for new part time MSA position
- Processed donations to the Annual Fund, including tracking donation amounts, issuing thank you letters and donation receipts
- Calculated July-December 2023 sales tax and submitted to County Treasurer
- Created a log of deposits and debits to the LHR Check Book in 2023
- Conducted annual employee evaluation for Museum Services Associate (Hannah)
- Installed software on new Director's computer; took inventory of current computer workstation stats and developed a plan for shifting computers where they are needed
- Provided educational programming at LHR to 1<sup>st</sup> grade students from Black River Falls
- Travelled to the Fennimore Doll & Toy Museum to transfer artifacts and to provide them Past Perfect catalog training
- Downloaded data from the environmental humidity/temperature recorders at the off-site storage rooms and in the Museum Building; crunched data for analysis

# **April Anderson**

#### **Monroe County Nutrition Coalition**

Members provided updates. We discussed how promotional efforts for the January Physical Activity were going. A survey was sent out to members to gather feedback on meeting attendance. We reflected on our accomplishments for 2023. The coalition was represented at several community events and health fairs!

#### Monroe County Mental Health Coalition

At our planning session on January 18<sup>th</sup> we decided that we will adjust the structure of the meetings so we can use our time together to move forward on our goals. Most of our meeting time will be spent working in one of three workgroups (event planning/social media, education and training, and systems change and advocacy). We will meet in person on a quarterly basis.

# Monroe County Dementia & Brain Health Coalition

On February 1<sup>st</sup> I attended this meeting for the first time. We discussed upcoming events including The Longest Day and The Greatest Gift You'll Ever Give. We also discussed including articles in the ADRC newsletter. I offered to submit one on nutrition for brain health. I also shared UW-Madison resources including the Center for Healthy Minds and the "Dementia Matters" podcast.

#### **HEAL (Healthy Eating, Active Living)**

On January 22nd I gave a presentation on the Health and Well-Being Institute, my programming, coalition work, and outreach activities for Sparta Lion's Club members where they learned about FoodWIse, StrongBodies, the Aging Mastery Program, Mental Health First Aid, WeCOPE, QPR, my "Health Matters" newspaper column, and UW-Madison resources.

#### **FoodWise**

Lessons with first grade students at the WIN after school program at Herrman Elementary are going well. Students have been learning about trying new foods, grocery shopping and cooking. They've sampled grape tomatoes, hummus and triscuits, and Greek yogurt so far.

Nutrition lessons at Heritage Haven wrapped up on January 17<sup>th</sup>. During the last lesson participants learned about dietary fats and they were able to sample chicken wild rice soup. It was a big hit!

Lessons with the children at Ahuco Head Start are going very well. The children have been learning about trying new foods, eating a rainbow of colors, and dairy. They've sampled veggie dip and pita crackers, frozen grapes, and string cheese. One girl shared that she felt "shivery" after eating some frozen grapes.

#### **StrongBodies**

The Tomah StrongBodies classes are going incredibly well! There are currently 33 participants and 6 volunteer leaders! New participants are welcomed and encouraged to join at any time.

The virtual classes are going very well. Sixty to eighty people are regularly attending! After class participants have been learning about almonds, meatless meals, split peas, rice, and creating savoring rituals.

#### **WeCOPE**

The virtual WeCOPE class is going very well!
After the first session a participant sent an email that stated: "I thoroughly enjoyed the session today! You are both skilled facilitators." There are ten participants that are regularly attending the sessions. We are already over half-way through with only two sessions left.

#### HCE

I compiled and sent out a February/March newsletter. Members are gearing up for our county meeting which will be on February 21st.

#### **Health Matters Newspaper Column**

I submitted four articles to the newspaper in January. The first article encouraged people to find their flow which is when you are so engaged in an activity that you lose track of time. The second article was all about oatmeal, which is a heart healthy whole grain that is high in fiber. The third article encouraged people who are able to donate blood. The final article was about eating late at night which can provide benefits and downsides.

#### **Black Bean Brownies**

Makes 12 brownies

#### Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 cups black beans (1 15-oz can, drained and rinsed very well)
- 2 Tablespoons cocoa powder
- 1/2 cup quick oats
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/3 cup honey
- 2 Tablespoons sugar
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 cup chocolate chips

#### **Directions:**

Preheat oven to 350 F. Combine all ingredients except chips in a good food processor, and blend until completely smooth. Really blend well. (A blender can work if you absolutely must, but the texture—and even the taste—will be much better in a food processor.) Stir in the chips, then pour into a greased 8×8 pan. Optional: sprinkle extra chocolate chips over the top. Cook the black bean brownies 15-18 minutes, then let cool at least 10 minutes before trying to cut. If they still look a bit undercooked, you can place them in the fridge overnight and they will magically firm up!

2 Mini Muffins

#### Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cups flour
- ¾ teaspoon baking powder
- ¾ teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 2 medium ripe bananas mashed (about 1 cup)
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ¾ cup shredded zucchini
- 1/3 cup oil

#### Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- Mix flour baking powder, baking soda, salt and cinnamon and set aside.
- Combine mashed bananas, sugar, egg, oil and vanilla in a large bowl.
   Add flour mixture and stir gently until mixed.
- 4. Fold zucchini into batter.
- 5. Line muffin tins with paper or spray with pan spray.
- 6. Fill each muffin reservoir ¾ full.
- Bake for 10-12 minutes or until lightly browned and top springs back when touched.
- 8. Remove muffins from tin and store in air tight container or freeze.

# February 14th, 2024 - Staff Report

#### **LCD Business:**

- Coon Creek Watershed Two public meetings were held on January 18<sup>th</sup> in Cashton and the Village of
  Coon Valley to discuss the PL566 Dams (PEIS-Plan) moving forward. The plan outcome and federal
  support is to decommission all 14 dams in the Coon Creek Watershed. The Coon Valley meeting was well
  attended by agency personal, farmers and concerned citizens. The main point of discussion, some
  attendees feel the Federal Government is decommissioning the dams and leaving the watershed
  without a watershed plan in place for the future. Reminded attendees the Land Conservation
  Department and NRCS are always available to assist with conservation efforts.
- Tree Sales Program Sold 362 bundles or \$9001.00 to date.
- <u>Stewardship Awards Banquet</u> 164 people attended the banquet to recognize our three Land Stewardship Award Winners and our youth poster contest winners. Lots of positive comments from attendees on a great night. Thanks to the NR&E committee for supporting this event!
- <u>CWD Task Force</u> Held a meeting on January 31<sup>st</sup> to discuss 2023 hunting season and CWD results. DNR personal covered harvest numbers, which reflect the state average. 675 deer were sampled for CWD and 7 came back positive in Monroe County. 41 deer were donated to the food pantries. Plans for 2024 include hosting a couple CWD Summits in new locations: Sparta Library and the Tomah Sports Alliance are potential sites. Continue utilizing our sampling/dumpster sites throughout the county while incorporating the 4 High Schools into the sampling program.
- <u>CWD Facility Tour</u> Kevin Wallenfang DNR Biologist gave a presentation and tour of the bio-secure processing facility. Main takeaway from the tour: DNR prefers the deer head sample vs nodes, because state wide about 50 percent come back with the wrong material. No time savings for the hunter, if he submits the head vs node!

#### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A FOREST MAINTENANCE AND DEVELOPMENT ACCOUNT

WHEREAS, Monroe County has been managing the county forest and parks since 1933; and

WHEREAS, the demand for forest products, recreational opportunities, wildlife habitat and watershed protection have increased substantially during the past 90 years; and

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Strategic Plan 2023 proposes several strategies to enhance recreational opportunities within the county and identify sources of funding.

WHEREAS, the Monroe County Forestry Department has returned significant amounts of surplus funds to the General Fund in the past two decades and the timber sale revenues obtained from the county forest should be used to develop, maintain and improve the county forest, parks and trails for future use; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Resources and Extension Committee realizes that investing forestry revenue into the maintenance and development of our county forest and parks will stimulate the economy and provide additional outdoor recreational opportunities for the public.

WHEREAS, the Natural Resources and Extension Committee is recommending that the Monroe County board authorize the establishment of a Forest Maintenance and Development Account for the Forestry Department; and

WHEREAS, the Forest Maintenance and Development Account will provide fiscal planning for operational and capital expenses such as tree planting, invasive species control, park and trail development and land acquisition.

WHEREAS, the fund will be established in 2024 with yearend 2023 audited balances and would be monitored by the Monroe County Finance Committee and the Monroe County Natural Resources & Extension Committee. Approval for the use of these funds will be through the appropriate budgeting procedures as set forth by the Monroe County Board.

NOW. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Monroe County Board of Supervisors that they do hereby authorize the Finance Department to reassign 80% of the Forestry Department's surplus revenue each year going forward. Surplus revenue shall be determined upon the close of the fiscal year accounting. The funds will be placed in a Forest Maintenance and Development Account, which shall be a non-lapsing account.

Dated this 28th of February 2024.

Offered by the NATURAL RESOURCES and EXTENSION COMMITTEE.

Fiscal Note: This resolution will authorize the reassignment of surplus forestry revenue for 2023 and future years into a Forest Maintenance and Development Account. Per Wisconsin Statute 65.90 this resolution will require a 2/3 vote of the entire membership of the Monroe County Board of Supervisors for approval. Spending these funds will also require a 2/3rds majority unless the improvements are included in the annual county budget.

Purpose: This Resolution will authorize the Finance Department to establish a non-lapsing 37 38 Forest Maintenance and Development Account for future operational and capital expenses 39 such as tree planting, invasive species control, park and trail development and land 40 acquisition.

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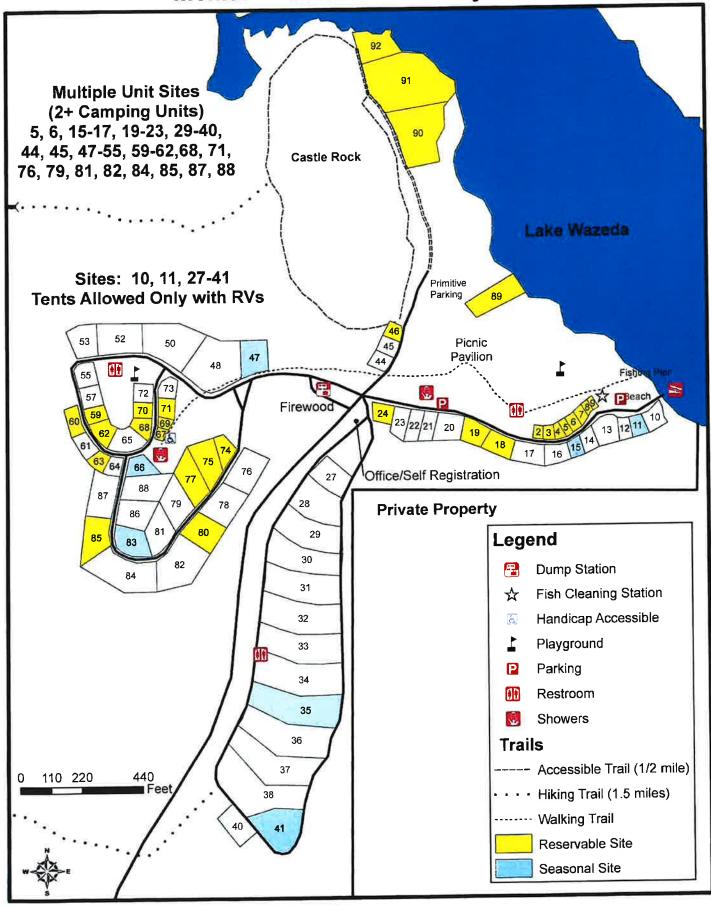
