- Processed artifact donations to LHR, assigning accession numbers and home locations and taking photos of each

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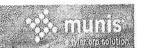

June 17th, 2024 - Staff Report

Bob Micheel – LCD – Director

LCD Business:

- Non-Metallic Mining Working with Monroe County Property & Maintenance on the Wisconsin White Sands2 & L&S Investments on their tax delinquent parcels. Held a conference call with key county staff and the DNR mining coordinator to review White Sands mining operation and next steps for the County.
- <u>DNR Violations</u> A fish kill on Moore Creek was reported the week of May 12th as a result of transfer pump failure at the separator barn. Manure runoff was documented twice by the DNR that week. Met with the landowner Al Ferris on site along with the DNR Warden, CAFO inspector and DNR non-point coordinator Friday, May 19th. Inspection report is being developed with potential fines.
 - *A CAFO farm in the Little La Crosse Watershed was recently fined for violating Wisconsin wastewater laws. (See attached press release)
- <u>CCTF</u> Coordinating a summer tour of the National Weather Service, solar farm, along with an agroforestry (Silva-pasture) project sometime in July. More information to follow.
- <u>PROTECT Grant</u> Entering the planning stage with the Hwy. Department and stakeholders as more program information is disseminated from program officials.
- <u>Tri-Creek</u> Received a notice of another parcel (40 acres) is for sale up-stream from the (Krueger) 20 acres purchased this past winter. Parcel link: <u>Lifestyle Property For Sale- 0 KERMIT AVENUE, Norwalk, WI 54648-BYU...</u> (midwestlifestyleproperties.com)
- Coon Creek PL566 Dams The comment period for the final PEIS for the Coon Creek and West Fork PL566 dams closes today. A resolution by Monroe County (Sponsor) NR&E Committee will be developed to move forward with the NRCS proposed action to decommission the 7 PL566 dams in the Coon Creek Watershed is planned for the July committee meeting. The resolution will support the action along with securing the grant agreement for NRCS to hire a private engineer to design the dam decommissioning projects. I've been meeting with landowners that hold PL566 dams on their property to discuss the decommissioning process. I attended a Coon Creek meeting to discuss future plans for the Coon Creek Watershed. Participants included elected state and local officials along with NRCS State and Area office staff including LCD staff from Vernon and La Crosse County. Consensus to continue working on climate smart land use to reduce flood impacts in the Coon Creek Watershed; which involves plan development and grant opportunities. Kickoff meeting held for the DNR 9 Key Element plan on June 11th.
- ROW Garbage Held a meeting with the Hwy. Department, Solid Waste, and the NR&E members to discuss the amount of waste ending up in our ROW across Monroe County. Consensus's on sources/issues while defining a few objectives to explore in the near future. Plan to meet again on June 25th to continue the conversation.

Phil Mlsna and Mlsna Dairy Supply, Inc. Assessed \$209,641.47 for Violations of Wisconsin's Wastewater Laws at their CAFO located in Sparta, Wis.

MADISON, Wis. – Attorney General Josh Kaul today, in partnership with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR), announced that Monroe County Judge Mark L. Goodman issued an order requiring Phil G. Mlsna and Mlsna Dairy Supply, Inc. to pay \$209,641.47 for violations of Wisconsin's wastewater laws at the concentrated animal feeding operation (CAFO) that they own and operate in Sparta, Wis.

"The WPDES permitting system is in place for a very good reason: to protect clean water," said AG Kaul. "As this case highlights, violations of our wastewater laws can result in significant penalties."

"Wisconsin's wastewater laws are in place to protect our environment and ensure safe, clean water for Wisconsinites. Violations of those laws are serious offenses, as they can contaminate our waters, harm wildlife and jeopardize public health," said Wisconsin DNR Assistant Deputy Secretary Mark Aquino. "We appreciate the efforts of the Wisconsin DOJ to hold violators accountable and protect our natural resources."

The defendants allowed the Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) permit for their CAFO to expire in 2015 and continued operating their large CAFO without a permit for years. During that time, the defendants were not subject to the laws that other legally permitted CAFOs within the state are required to follow. The defendants also constructed a sand separation system without plans and specifications approved by the DNR. The defendants were found liable for all 2,501 days on which the State alleged that they violated Wisconsin's wastewater laws.

After the State filed this case, the defendants submitted a complete application for a WPDES permit to DNR. DNR issued that permit effective September 1, 2023.

Judge Goodman held a court trial from November 6, 2023, to November 8, 2023, to receive evidence regarding the forfeiture that he should assess for defendants' violations. On May 16, 2024, Judge Goodman issued an order requiring defendants to pay \$209,641.47 total in forfeitures, surcharges, court costs, and attorney fees.

The investigation of this case was aided by tips from members of the public. The public can report tips anonymously to the DNR Tip Hotline at 1-800-TIP-WDNR (1-800-847-9367).

This case was prosecuted by Wisconsin Department of Justice Public Protection Unit Assistant Attorney General Emily M. Ertel and Paralegals Lisa Rossman and Sara Balde. DOJ staff worked closely with numerous DNR staff to obtain this result, including current Environmental Enforcement Specialist Andrea Gruen and now-retired Environmental Enforcement Specialist Deborah Dix.

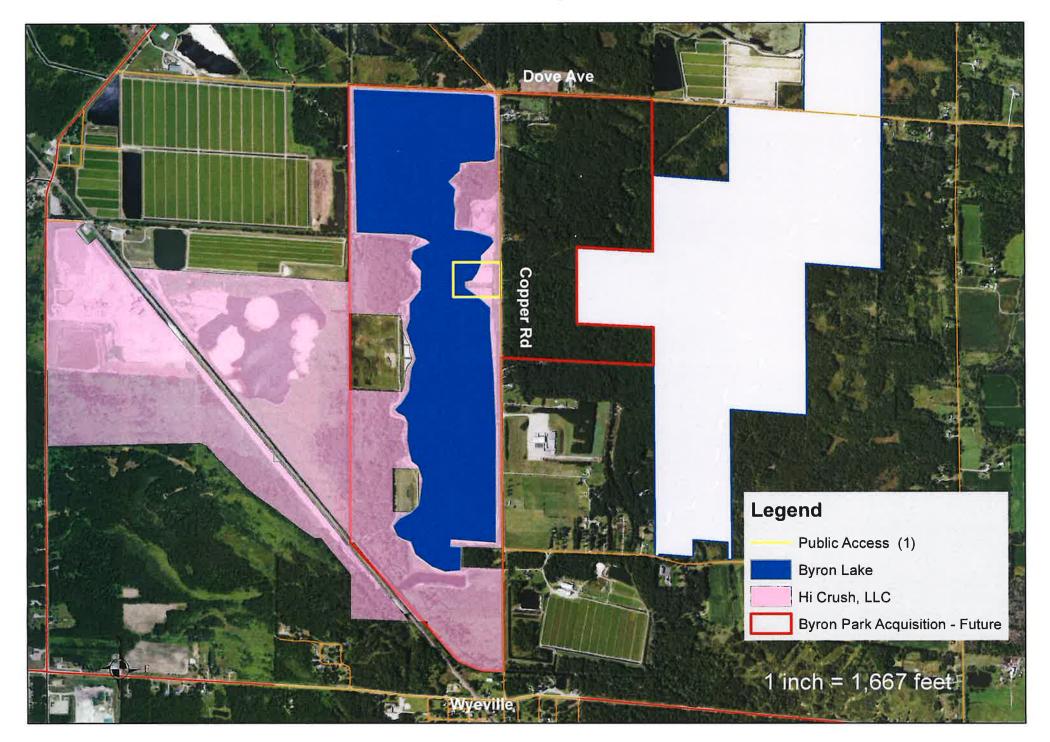

The Monroe County Forestry Department is offering five tracts of timber for sale on 365 acres. The tracts are located in the Town of Lincoln, New Lyme and Ridgeville. Sealed bids will be received on these tracts until 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 13, 2024 at the Forestry and Parks Office, 777 S. Black River Street, Suite 2, Sparta, WI 54656 and will be opened thereafter. The bids will be presented to the Natural Resource & Extension Committee at their meeting on June 17, 2024. Maps and bid forms are available from the Forestry and Parks Office upon request.

Insurance Requirement: Contractor's must carry at least one million dollars in liability insurance and Worker's Compensation insurance to bid on timber sales; the insurance must be carried through the duration of the work under the timber sale contract.

Bids must contain the following:

- Name, address and telephone number of bidder
- Price bid per ton, cord and/or MBF and total bid value 2)
- A check, money order or letter of credit of the approved type, for 10% of the total bid value for the tract to 3) serve as a bid bond. The minimum bid bond for any bid is \$1,500.00 or 10% of the total value, whichever is greater. All letters of credit should be valid for one year longer than the initial contract period.
- Proof of workers compensation insurance and liability insurance. The Forestry & Parks office has some 4) certificates of insurance on file, you may call ahead to verify.

We recommend verifying receipt of bids submitted via USPS.

Volumes listed are for advertising purposes only; bidders should make their own estimates of volume and quality. Bidders are responsible for checking requirements on the tract. Pulpwood may be sold on mill scale; saw bolts and saw logs will be scaled on the landing. The buyer will submit a list of mills where products will be sold and scale tickets will be purchased.

Minimum bids are listed on each sale. Bidders are encouraged to submit a bid even if they can't meet the minimums.

The following weight conversions will be used to convert cord scaled wood to tons:

Contracts will normally be awarded to the highest bidders for each tract. The bid bond for the successful bid will be retained as a performance bond for the contract. Monroe County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids, to waive any technicality in any bid, and to accept any bid that is deemed to be in the best interest of Monroe County. Bids may be rejected for several reasons, including but not limited to the following:

- Failure to follow bidding instructions listed above or not meeting the minimum bid per tract. 1)
- Unpaid stumpage due or unsatisfactory performance on existing contracts. 2)
- Violations of contracts or unsatisfactory performance on previous contracts. 3)

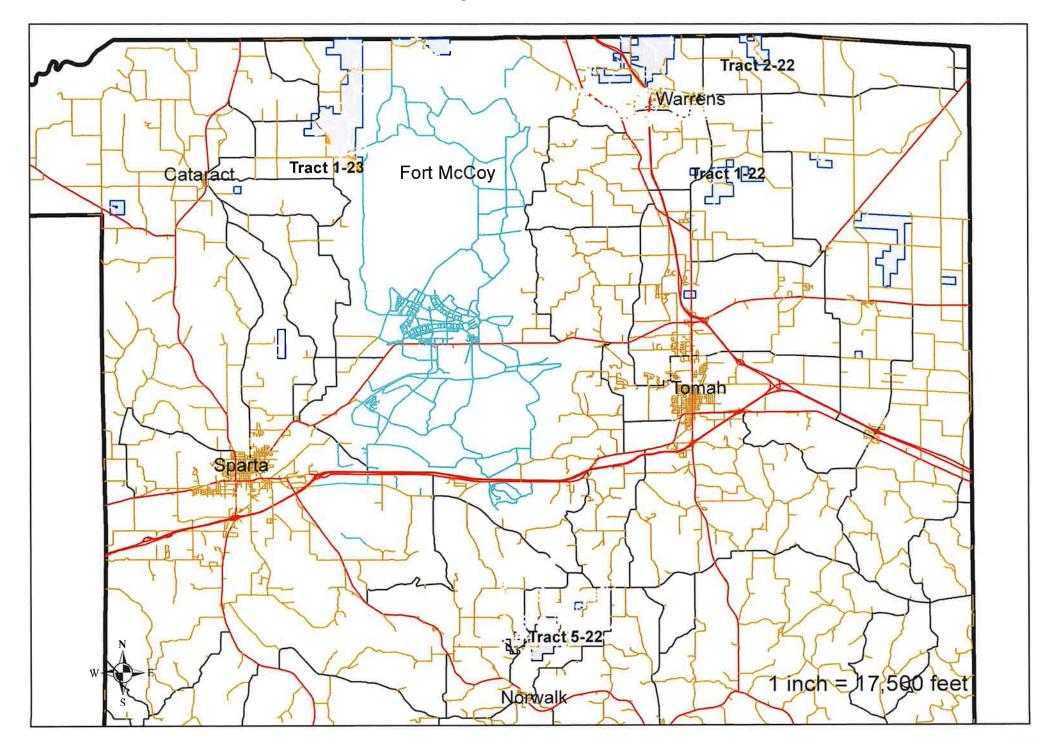

Monroe County Timber Sale Prospectus

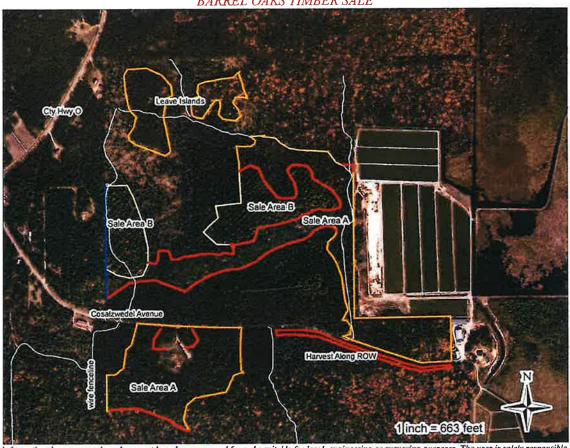

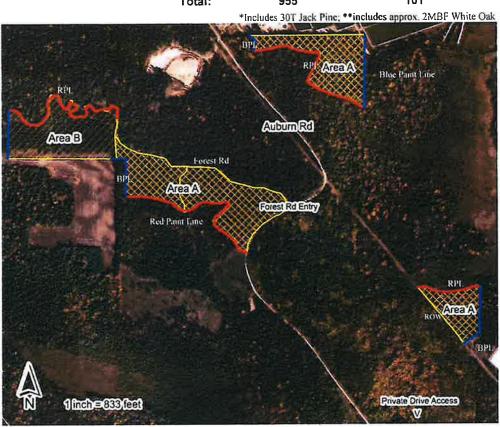
