### **Space Camp Counselors**

The Agent, state staff, and Barron County Educator worked to prepare counselor and other adult staff to lead the experience to 4-H Space Camp. There were 140 Space Campers, 15 youth counselors and 15 adult chaperones. The Agent accompanied the state delegation to Huntsville, AL, April 26-30.

### **Student Government Day**

The Agent has been working with the County Student Government Day Committee again this year. We completed one round on May 2 with Cashton Middle School and Sparta High Point. On May 9 we will welcome Norwalk, Ontario, Wilton Middle School. The first day went really well. We did something new this year. The youth held a County Board Session discussing a county sugar tax. There is an "Official" resolution that they debated in their classrooms. They sat in your county board seats and debated and voted just as you do. It was interesting how quiet they were. Mr. Kaftan and Schnitzler then added some debate and got the kids talking. It was a very interesting activity. A follow up meeting has been scheduled in June.

#### **Summer Camp**

Summer Camp has been a real struggle this year. Monroe County 4-H planned to join an Upham Woods Open Enrollment Camp again in 2018. The camp filled early but we were able to get 10 youth, Three counselors, and three adults in for the open camp.

On a brighter note The Agent and some motivated young adults are planning a county led and local Outpost Experience. This will be in Ontario at Wildcat State Park. We have three full days planned. We will start with canoeing on the Kickapoo. We need a certified lifeguard to join our effort but that is the last logistical hurdle. An adult volunteer has come forward to plan and take care of food needs which is a major part of a successful event. We are also partnering with the DNR to lead a Poaching CSI and Girls Self Protection Class. A Taekwondo Master has also agreed to lead the group in a session.

### Agriculture Extension Highlights Update April 6, 2018 through May 8

The Cover Crops Field Day on April 7<sup>th</sup> was effectively snowed out. Ted Bay, retired Grant county Ag Agent is working on a project for Winrock Foundation to increase the use of cover crops in the Kickapoo River watershed. A small group met at the Portland Town Hall to discuss what was planted in the field across the road and discuss cover crops in general.

The Ag Agent worked with the state Agribility coordinators to meet with some of the Amish community near Cashton to discuss the possibility of outreach efforts to help make the Amish aware of different Agribility resources that would be appropriate for Amish people to use. Examples include different handles for hand tools and some coloring books with safety lessons that were developed at Purdue with Amish communities in Indiana. We will be doing some follow up with this project.

The Ag Agent has continued to work with greenhouse bedding plant growers on troubleshooting problems in the bedding plants and flowers over the past month. In addition, visits with Brian Hudelson, UW Plant Disease Diagnostic Clinic Manager were done on May 4<sup>th</sup>.

The Ag Agent worked with several farmers one on one over the past month to address a wide variety of topics including rules on growing hemp, evaluating beef cattle rations, building and facility improvements (including helping the new La Crosse county Ag Agent with a farmer), farm management and records analysis.

The Ag Agent has cooperators lined up for the hops nitrogen trials again this year, a corn nitrogen trial again this year, and a corn starter fertilizer trial this year. A European Corn Borer Variant monitoring project is also being investigated. There will likley be some high school kids serving as co-investigators on these projects.

The Ag Agent will be operating a black light trap again this year in cooperation with the Dept. Of Ag Pest Monitoring Program.

The Ag Agent was the guest speaker at the Tomah Lions meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup>. He gave an overview of the nitrogen trials that UW Extension is going with the hops growers.

The Ag Agent attended the quarterly Monroe County DHIA Board Meeting, and the monthly Monroe County Farm Bureau Board Meeting, both on April 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Ag Agent also attended the Western Wisconsin Beef Producers Board meeting on April 26<sup>th</sup>.

There were two Farm Progress Days Scholarships awarded this spring from the 1980 Farm Progress Days fund. Don Kortbein works with the Extension Office on that Scholarship. One to a student from Cashton and one from Tomah. There was one Western Wisconsin Beef Producers Scholarship awarded to a student from Tomah.

The Ag Agent conducted Adult Volunteer Certification Training for the 4-H Shotgun project for three adult volunteers on April 28<sup>th</sup> at Eau Claire.
