Financials/Invoices: Bike Me Fund registration was paid.

Administrators Report: Rolling Hills is still in the works. Highway B has lots of time yet to decide on. Property for parking downtown-not convinced it's needed at this time. Looking at a house by the Administrative Center to home Zoning, Sanitation and UW Extension staff. Would like to bring back Jason Gilman to come and talk about housing development for the area. Bigger cities are coming in on the smaller cities. Concerns with the farming industries that need to be addressed. Jason has been the Land Use planner for the City of La Crosse for three years. It would pay for itself with a good planner.

EDCT Coordinators Report:

Monthly report-activities are very high. Going across the river to get them involved. TID was approved in Tomah along I-90. Industrial Park is moving along. The progress is moving along quicker than was expected.

Cashton-new child care center where Pasture Pride building was. Cashton has had quite a bit of growth-new bank building to start early July. Two story bank with three business along with it.

Wilton-Cooperative, new warehouse next to the feed mill.

Graceland Fruit in Wilton-hoping to get a tour in within the next month.

Lou Guard de Reunion meeting-Hispanic population, grasp on what they want to do-step up and not just work on farms. Give them the tools and be educated to work in higher paying fields. The kids cannot

communicate with their parents very well. They have a language barrier. Sanchez-his contract comes to an end when the school contract comes up.

Lots of things that need to be discussed before anything can take place. T-Grant money could be available to use for the bridge replacement. Coincide with the school being done.

Land Use planner would be able to get the citizens involved and plan out who is going to pay for it and where it would run through. Find money to help assist with the funding-grants. There will be development going on in that area and would help elevate the traffic issue. Good road all the way to 21. General Ave is not wide enough and the hill. Meeting in June.
