The meeting was posted in accordance with the open meeting law. Meeting was called to order at 9:06am by Chair Sharon Folcey. Roll-call was taken.

Motion by T. Tyma to approve the minutes of the Feb, 9th meeting. Second by M.J. Hill. Motion carried.

Acting Monroe County Administrator Jim Bialecki was introduced and everyone introduced themselves who were attending the meeting. J. Bialecki told the Committee that he was going to get up to speed on all the great things we are doing. He also said he was scheduling a meeting with S. Peterson in the upcoming weeks to get updated on the County's economic development projects.

FINANCIALS:

- S. Folcey handed out a budget summary that was used to make the current budget and expenses easier to understand.
- Invoices presented: there were no invoices presented for approval.
- B. Arena announced that she was retiring after her term as President of Hidden Valleys of Southwest Wisconsin is up in May. She said they were looking for a replacement for her on the Board. They are also searching for a replacement for her representing Monroe County too.
- S. Peterson updated the Committee on the upcoming BIKE ME Fun Ride that will be taking place on the Elroy-Sparta Bike Trail on June 2-3. The Committee has funded the ride for \$500 that the BIKE ME Fun Ride Committee could use as matching funds with their \$10,000 JEM Grant application which was approved earlier in 2017. Peterson asked the Committee for another \$500 this year so the Committee could be considered a \$1,000 sponsor of the ride. Motion by T. Thompson to give an additional \$500 to the ride this year. 2nd by T. Hyma. Motion Carried.

S. Peterson reported that with a 2-day Conference, additional expenses were expected but some were not anticipated. He also stated that even though conference sponsorships went well, there were a few last-minute drops of some businesses who were going to be sponsors. With those issues and that the County kept the same \$2,000 sponsorship level this year even though the Conference had expanded to 2 days, S. Peterson said that he was at a financial loss with the Conference. The Committee felt that they could offer additional financial support by paying for the portfolios that were given to all attendees and the extras used in the future for business recruitment presentations. Motion made by D. Berg that the committee pay up to \$3,000 for the portfolios. 2nd by T. Thompson. The Committee asked S. Peterson to supply a balance sheet outlining the shortfall and the cost of the portfolios before a payment would be given. S. Peterson agreed that he would do that and suggested to the Committee that adding additional money to next year's Conference should be looked at when the new budget is being put together. Motion carried.

REPORTS:

Hidden Valleys - B. Arena

- Reminded the Committee that the Hidden Valleys Annual Meeting is on May 17th at the White
 House Restaurant in Richland Center. They are recognizing Monroe County as the spotlighted
 County in this year's magazine. The Committee is going to try to have members attend and display
 our banners at the event.
- So far this Trade Show season has been a big success. A lot of magazines have already been handed out at the shows and there is a lot of interest in the Southwest Wisconsin region wherever they go.
- The process of looking for a replacement for Bernie's position with Hidden Valleys has started and they hope to have someone on board by the Annual Meeting.

Ft. McCoy - T. Fitzgerald

- S. Peterson updated the Committee about the W.I.S.E. Plan that is studying workforce issues affecting the area today and in the future. Question sessions with area businesses have started and will continue over the next month.

WATA

• S. Folcey told the committee that they should consider not rejoining the organization this year. They have raised their membership rates and it seems like WATA is not doing well as an organization and probably isn't a good investment now.

TOMAH CHAMBER OF COMMERCE & VISITORS CENTER

- T. Thompson Introduced Leah Burns as the new Event Coordinator for the Chamber. She will be working on attracting events to the City and Recreation Park.
- New Chamber Office Building project continues to move forward. 4-6 weeks away from completion.
- Annual Banquet held at Cranberry County Lodge. Sell-out crowd & many deserving award winners.

SPARTA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

- T. Hyma said that it's trade show season. Had successful shows at 2 shows in Iowa. Heading to work the Bike Show in Madison before heading to the Tourism Conference in Milwaukee.
- Working on the new Spartan Race a mudder type race being coordinated by organizers, the Chamber and Ft. McCoy.
- Hired 2 new employees Holly Carlson & Wendy Markeren.
- T. Hyma announced that he is retiring as the CEO of the Chamber, effective in early June. He wants to spend more time with his family. The Chamber Board will start the process of replacing him over the next upcoming weeks.
