Be it remembered that on the 18th day of June 1858 I was surveying the Nth of N E $\frac{7}{8}$ Sec: 12. 16. 3 West by request of the owner of the same Mr. John Grudsk and proceeded as follows to wit.

Commenced at the NE Corner of said Sec: 4:

The corner Stake with bearing tree was destroyed but a Stone was found in the middle of the Road; that there at some former time for a Sec: Corner; Thence W to the $\frac{7}{8}$ on the N side of the Sec: where also a Stone was found on the Road and in the right place according to the Stamp of the P. T. distance 40 Ch 34 Links; Thence the 8 Stake on this line was established at equal distance between these 2 points. Thence the Sec: was carefully measured from the $\frac{7}{8}$ Stake on the N side to that on the S. side distance 80 Ch 63 Links and the $\frac{7}{8}$ Stake on the Centre of the Sec: was estab: at equal distance between them Thence E from the $\frac{7}{8}$ Stake on the Centre to the $\frac{7}{8}$ Stake on the East side, distance 40 Ch 42 Links Thence the 8 Stake on this Line was estab: at equal distance between these 2 points.
