Be it remembered that on the 28th day of
July 1858 I was surveying a State Road from
Horton Jackson Co to Calumet Monroe Co
Wis according to an act of the Legislature
of Wis. approved March 15th 1858 by order of
the appointed commissioners of Halberst
of Monroe Co & Benj. Merrill of Jackson
County and proceeded as follows to wit
I commenced at a stake put into the ground
near the Liberty Pole on Front Street in the
Village of Milwaukeeport town of Horton
Jackson Co Wis thence N 53° E 68 Lumber thence
S 23° E 1 Ch 68 Lumber to the Trempealeau River, thence
in the same direction across the River 37 Lumber
said River are 2 1/2 feet deep, thence in the same
direction 3 Ch 84 Lumber to the Mellere, thence in
the same direction across the Mellere 45 Lumber
thence in the same direction 38 Ch 22 Lumber to
a Grove Yard on the East side of the Road thence
S 8° E 20 Ch thence in the same direction 20 Ch 70 L
where it intersects with a former laid out Road
leading to Black R Falls, thence N 82° E 20 Ch 74 L
to the ⁴ Line of Section 20, 22, 5 West thence S 8° East
30 Ch to a Swamp, ^{4 Ch 100 L is a small stream running West 1/2 feet deep 4 feet wide} thence in the same direction 6 Ch 10 L, thence
24 Ch 20 L to the SW Corner of SW 1/4 Sec 28, 22, 5 W / 7 Ch: from last
mentioned point is a Road leading to Black R Falls, thence in the
same direction 59 Ch 85 L to the SW Corner of Sec: 28, 22, 5 W
thence in the same direction 20 Ch to a small stream 2 feet
wide running ^{West} through a 4 Rods wide Swamp, thence
in the same direction 8 Ch, thence S 18° E 24 Ch 20 Lumber
thence S 35 1/2 W to the top of the Bluff / Merrill's Gap / 5 Ch 30.
thence S 16° E 42 Ch to a Stake. 4 Rods N of said Stake is a small
stream running West 1/2 feet wide, thence S 30° E 20 Ch:
thence S 9° E 8 Ch to a stream 3 feet wide, and further in
the same direction ^{14 Ch:} to a Black Pine 20" in diameter
