Field miners, it being the time and place fixed by us in said notice, and having first been satisfied that the said notice aforesaid had been duly given five days previous to our said meeting, to all the occupants of the lands through which said highway passes and had also been posted in three public places in said town ten days before the time of our said meeting in the manner required by law; we did then and there proceed to examine personally said highway and did hear all reasons that were offered for or against the attorney of said highway and did decide upon such application, and it being our opinion that the public good will thereby be promoted did decide to attorney said highway as herein after described.

Now therefore pursuant to said application we the said supervisors, do her by order and determine that a highway be and is hereby attorney as follows. Legay & being the time and place fixed by us in said notice and having first been satisfied that the notice aforesaid had been duly given 5 days previous to the time of our said meeting to all the occupants of the lands through which said highway passes, and had also

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been posted up in at least three public places in said town ten days before the time of our meeting in the manners prescribed by law, we did then and there proceed to examine personally said highway and did hear all reasons that were offered for or against altering the same and did decide upon such application and it being our opinion that the public good will thereby be promoted did decide to lay out said highway as herein after described.
