A parcel of land 3 rods wide in the N.W. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 of section 25 in 16 N.W. 1 West. The centerline of which is described as follows: Commencing at the S.E. corner of the S.W. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 of said section 25, thence North 14° 45' feet to point of beginning, thence North 10° 15' thence on a curve to the West of 200 feet radius a distance of 300 feet, thence N. 62 degrees East a distance of 300 feet, thence on a curve to the East of 300 feet radius a distance of 220 feet, thence North 13 degrees 1C East a distance of 311 feet, thence on a curve to the East of 300 feet radius a distance of 31 feet, thence North 13 degrees 1C East, thence on a curve to the East a distance of 140 feet, thence N. 62 degrees East a distance of 300 feet, thence on a curve to the East of 300 feet radius a distance of 300 feet, thence N. 62 degrees East a distance of 450 feet, thence on a curve to the West of 200 feet radius a distance of 233 feet to the center of the present road.
