Revised Statutes of Wisconsin for 1898

Section 1329a

Any person or corporation may, with the written consent of the supervisors of the town, construct and operate a line of telegraph, telephone, or electric light wires for the purpose of transmitting light or power along and within the limits of any highway, subject to the conditions and restrictions herein contained.

All poles used in the construction of such lines shall be set not less than four feet from the boundary line of such highway and in such manner as not to interfere with the use of such highway by the public nor with the use of the adjoining land by the owner thereof, and all wires strung upon such poles shall be not less than twenty four feet above the ground at all crossings and not less than fourteen feet above the ground at all other places.

But no tree shall be cut, trimmed or the branches thereof cut or broken in the construction or maintenance of such line without the consent of the owner of such tree.




