

Well attended Town meeting called
according to law to be held in
the town of Eaton for the purpose of electing
Town officers for next term, which meeting was
held at the house of Tim Crocker on the
sixth day of May 1856, said Town having failed
to hold their Town Meeting on the first Tuesday of
April after being organized, as provided by Law,
Tim Crocker was chosen Clerk now of the
meeting, and A. H. Johnson and C. S. England
were chosen Clerk and Supervisor, after which
the following regulations and by laws were
voted upon and carried, to wit, that the Town
raise Twenty Five dollars for the improvement
of roads and Twenty five dollars for schools
purposes, also voted that the stage company known
as Wilson's will be invited Eaton; also passed a law
that no man residing within town boundary five
miles shall be a voter or voter.
