

Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered and whether the monument was found or restored through acceptance of an obliterated evidence location.

No bearing trees of record were located.

The government notes show that there is a creek, 1.98 chains (130.68) to the East of this corner. The current creek crosses the fence line at a distance of $110^{\circ}\pm$. The creek lies within a flat area and it is difficult to tell if it has moved or not.

Dechant has informed me that when he set the Center of Section 14 he used a 3/4" iron rod that he found at this location. He stated that Gary Sime had placed it there for this corner. No record was found of a survey that shows this corner or a tie sheet that would show how the location of this corner was determined.

This location is 41.2' South and 26.6' East of the mid-point between the SW & SE Corners.

The fence is in this area is somewhat erratic, most likely due to the rock wall located along the West side of the creek. Though it has been maintained by land owners and accepted as the property lines.

Since Dechant used this location to establish the Center of Section and several interior '40' Corners based off this location, I decided to accept the 3/4" iron rod as the best available evidence of the original government corner and replaced it with a Harrison Monument.


Describe or show any material discrepancy between the location of the restored corner and that of the corner previously restored or re-established.

John Davidson established this corner in January 1852.

Gary Dechant performed a survey in Section 14, in April 2005, in which he shows that he set the Center of Section. He does not show this corner on his map, but he has verbally stated that he found a 3/4" iron rod at this corner.
