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

History of corner establishment since Original Government Survey

Fred Holden found an original bearing tree still standing when he used this corner in a May, 1904 survey.

Description of corner evidence found:

I accepted a four-way occupied fence corner as the best available evidence of the original government corner. After analyzing the evidence found in the NEI/4 of Section 29, I did not feel that it was necessary to measure West from Center 1/4 to the existing stones at the West 1/4 and CW1/16.
