In his survey done in November of 1901, Fred Holden shows an iron pipe at this corner.

Description of corner evidence found:

I found an old iron monument about 6" South of the East-West tie post. The monument had a 2%" round top and was 18" long. This must be Holden's corner as I found a rotted stump to the Northeast that fits his notes. I set a Harrison marker South of and leaning to the North and over the old monument. The Harrison is the corner. I mounded stones around the Harrison. Holden's old corner appears to be wagon thimble. This has happened before where Holden calls for a pipe and I found a thimble. The thimble appears to be a pipe before you dig it out.
