Description of corner evidence found:

Set in north-south fence where woven wire runs north and barb wire runs south. There is also a large pile of dead elm branches to the Southwest that fits the bearing and distance of the "Elm called for in the Original Notes". Because of the large pile we were not able to find the stump, which we assumed to be under the large pile of branches, but am confident this to be the original elm bearing tree. This corner location fits the half mile to the south very well. Going north a half mile, it appears that a chain was dropped as it measures 2581+.
