

Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered and whether the monument was found or restored through acceptance of an obliterated evidence location.

No bearing trees of record were located.

I found a 3/4" iron rod in the bottom of a ravine, within 6 inches of the computed location based from Carroll's survey. It also matches Dechant's location to within a foot.

I found no record of the origin of this monument.

This monument matches occupation from the East & West. There is no occupation in the general area from the North or South.

This location has been used in several surveys in both Section 16 & 17.

l accepted the location of the 3/4" iron rod as the best available evidence of the original government corner. Due to the very rocky condition at the bottom of the ravine, I did not replace it with a Harrison Monument.

Describe or show any material discrepancy between the location of the restored corner and that of the corner previously restored or re—established.


Noah Phelps established this corner in August 1847.

Patrick Carroll was at this corner, in May 2006, during a survey in Section 16. He shows that he found a 3/4" iron rod in place.

Gary Dechant was at this corner, in May 2012, during a survey in Section 17. He shows an existing Cast Iron County Monument at this corner.

Map Showing Distance And Direction To Other Public Land Survey




