

History of corner establishment since Original Government Survey

In a 1896 road survey in Section 35, Hamilton LaRue shows this corner being in the centerline of the road (as per Town Road Records). Holden shows this corner as existing in a survey done in April of 1901.

Description of corner evidence found:

I accepted the occupied corner as the best available evidence of the original government corner. It fits the West line of Section 25 very well (see tie sheet #83). It matches the mile to the East very good for direction and is on line with the fence to the South. It is on line with the centerline to the West as called for in LaRue's 1896 road survey. Also, I measurre 1331.23 feet to the West to the occupied "forty" corner, and Holden calls for 1335.68 feet (not bad considering Holden's work).
